We want to make sure that a college education is accessible to all Long Island residents that want to attend college. Financial stress should not be a reason to deter young and bright students from obtaining the future they desire and achieving their dreams.

Here are some tips and suggestions on how to get started in your search, along with links to scholarships to apply to.

First, think about your identity and things that might make you eligible for specific scholarships. What is your heritage? What is your race, ethnicity or cultural background? What is your GPA? What field or major do you plan to go into? Then find scholarships that can fit into these parts of your identity. Try not to limit your options and apply to every scholarship you are eligible for.

Next, think about all the other things that make you unique. This could be languages you speak, religious affiliation, experiences with a particular dis/ability, artistic talent, athletic talents, special interests or even community involvements. #### **Eligibility:**

- Applicants must intend to enroll in an accredited educational institution for the 2021-22 academic year.

**Award:** Scholarship award amount varies.

**Deadline:** January 5<sup>th</sup>, 2022

- There is no age limit for applicants, but you must also be a U.S. citizen or legal resident.

**Award:** \$1,000
