When We Keep Families In Their Homes, We Can Keep Children In Their Schools.



Funded by The Siemer Institute, United Way of Long Island provides navigation services to families with children who have difficulty maintaining self-sufficiency and have risk factors that can lead to homelessness.

The Family Support Project Provides:

- Case Management and Coaching
- Financial Assistance to Alleviate Immediate Housing Crises
- Financial Counseling
- Job Training Referrals and Support
- Access to Food and Nutrition Education

These services allow families to remain in their homes, children to remain in their schools, and adults to work toward a brighter future.

The Results:

- Nearly 100% of all families avoid disruptive school moves
- Over 90% of families successfully obtain or maintain stable housing
- Financial empowerment resources and coaching
