We're on a mission to increase opportunities for students who face unique financial challenges which can make education seem out of reach. United Way's Scholarship program is an undergraduate college scholarship program that may be used to pay for tuition, fees and room and board, or commuter allowances, if applicable.

DREAMS for Youth Academic Scholarship:

- Awards range from \$1,000 – Up to \$3,000 for the first year of college
- Open to graduating seniors attending a 4-year college/ university or vocational program
- Awards paid over 2 semesters and are based on maintaining a 2.0 GPA
- All payments sent directly to the school

The Camilla G. Belser Memorial Scholarship Fund:

- Open to graduating seniors attending a 2-year program at Nassau or Suffolk Community College. Other accredited two-year colleges will be considered
- Awards paid over 4 semesters and are based on maintaining a 2.0 GPA

The Anthony J. Stupore Memorial Scholarship Fund:

- Open to graduating seniors majoring in Business Administration/Finance

The Robert B. Read Memorial Scholarship Fund:

- Open to graduating seniors attending University of Michigan

The Scott Martella Memorial Scholarship Fund:

- Open to graduating seniors majoring in Public Service (Teaching, Nursing, Non-profit management, Political Science, Social Work, Psychology)

Eligibility Criteria

To qualify, applicants must:

- Be a current resident of Long Island
- Attend a High School in Nassau or Suffolk Counties
- Be involved with community service activities
- Show demonstrated financial need
- Complete the scholarship application by the deadline

April 28: Deadline to submit applications

June 30: Awards announced

Application Checklist

Applications will only be considered complete and valid when all items listed below are submitted together.

- 2024 Scholarship Application
- Copy of parent/guardian's most recent Annual Income Tax Return (blackout all SS#'s)
- Household Gross Annual Income
- Applicant and Parent/Guardian Disclosure
- Student's school transcript (for graduating high school seniors)
- Student's essay; (for graduating high school seniors; **one page only**)
- Two letters of recommendation (for graduating high school seniors)
- Copy of FASFA Student Aid Report (SAR) (for graduating high school seniors)
- Student's resume (for graduating high school seniors; include name on each page)

**Note to Guidance Counselors: Please provide transcript & recommendation letters to student for submission with all other items.*



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Application Tips

Here are some things you can do to prepare for a competitive application:

Talk to parents, counselors, mentors, and teachers about your plans and how to be a strong candidate for pre-college enrichment or college admission and student aid.

Carefully consider which teacher, school administrator, community leader or other non-family member to ask for a reference letter. You should select an individual who has engaged in your community service activities during the school year or summer and who can provide insight into your academic performance and potential for success in pursuing pre-college enrichment or a college/university degree.

For graduating high school seniors, apply for federal student aid. Go to www.FAFSA.ed.gov to familiarize yourself with the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) and to get more information on federal student aid. If you are a finalist, we will use this form to confirm your eligibility and better understand your financial needs.

Review your transcript to ensure your GPA and coursework meet the eligibility requirements.

Let our advisory board get to know you through a well written essay that conveys how your interests, goals, motivation, and experiences have shaped your decision to pursue pre-college enrichment or undergraduate degree. Be sure to have someone proof your essay for spelling and grammar.

Further Details

The United Way of Long Island Scholarship Advisory Board will review, select, and notify the recipient by July 17, 2023. All qualified applicants will be considered without regard to race, religion, national origin, gender, sexual orientation, or disability. Awards are distributed directly to the educational institution.

Applicant and parent/guardian signatures indicate that all information contained in the application is complete and factually accurate. If any information is found to be false, this may result in forfeiture of the scholarship award. It is the responsibility of the scholarship award recipient to submit reports at the end of the semester for which the scholarship was received.

For undergraduate college scholarships, grade reports are required at the end of each semester along with the next semester tuition bill. Students must achieve a GPA of 2.0 or above. Reasonable explanation and corrective action essays for those not achieving the required GPA will be considered.
